Personalised Learning through Coaching (PLC)

This could be for you!

Have you ever considered taking a higher degree? Are you concerned about time and resources? Have courses you've considered just not had the right fit? If you have answered yes to any of these questions why not take a look at our Personalised Learning through Coaching (PLC) module.

Flexibility for professional learners

Designed specifically for working professionals this module enables you to take your learning as far as you want in the time that you want. It gives you the freedom to find where you want to go and the support to get you there.

The PLC award

PLC is a standalone module that carries 30 Masters level credits, which counts towards the qualification of your choice. This module enrolls you in the university and enables you to personalise your curriculum to your individual needs and interests. Most importantly PLC gives you the confidence and skills to make those choices.

Your personal development coach

You will be assigned a personal development coach to support you on the module. During coaching sessions you will explore and identify your current skills and how you can develop further. These sessions can take place face-to-face or via communication technology: the choice is yours.

From reflective learning to your assessment

You will have your own personal reflection space via an ePortfolio. Here you will be able to reflect on your learning, share and discuss ideas with your peers, coach and tutors, and gather and store resources. These reflections will build over time into a portfolio of evidence, which becomes the module assessment.

A suite of tools is available to help you assess your skills and progress throughout the course. Access to digital resources will help you broaden your understanding of coaching, the self-development process, research techniques, evaluation, critical analysis and web-based communication technologies. These will enable you to become a confident and independent learner.

PLC is currently being piloted and places on this module are limited. Each student's fees will be funded. Students will be invited to provide feedback on the module. This will only take a small amount of time and can be done remotely.

Q&A

What is the content?

- An introduction to personalising your curriculum at Masters Level
- Models of coaching and an overview of how it can impact on learning
- Application and evaluation of selected learning theory relating to self-direction.
- Active critique and analysis of the technologies available to support reflective learning
- Reflective practice and effective research skills.

How will it work?

- The module is delivered through online learning and one-to-one coaching, supported by diagnostic tools, the use of an ePortfolio and group activities through social technologies.

How much time do I have to take out of school and how long will it take to complete?

- Typically the module is completed within one year but this is flexible for individual needs. As the module is delivered electronically, we do not envisage that there will be a need to take time out of school, unless you wish to meet your coach face-to-face.
- 30 masters level credits represents approximately 300 hours of study in total, including assessment.

Is there any additional information I can pass on to school?

- We do not have materials available as of yet for schools but more materials will be available shortly. This will be linked to the Leading Edge Scheme which includes the MSc in Leadership and Management delivered by the Carnegie Faculty of Sport and Education at Leeds Metropolitan University

Would the pilot unit together with the Learning from Leadership Pathways credits amount to a Post Graduate Certificate?

- A Post Graduate Certificate is 60 credits. If you exit at this point, having completed both modules, you will carry 60 credits, which are sufficient for a university postgraduate certificate.
